

You are going to create a United States passport! Instead of stamps, your passport will tell us, in Spanish, where you have been around the world.

The following will be supplied:

Construction paper (one white sheet)
Cover page, signature page and information page.

The rest of the passport will be filled with two stories. Page three and four:

Page three will be a picture of the place where you went (use your imagination).

Page four will be your story (5-7 sentences), using the past tense (preterite), talking about what you did when you went to your destination.

Page five and six:

Page five will be a picture of the place where you are vacationing right now (again, use your imagination).

Page six will be your story (5-7 sentences), using present tense and PRESENT PROGRESSIVE, talking about what you are doing currently on your vacation.

Page seven (back cover):

Please attach your rubric to the back cover. Don't forget to include your name on your rubric.

Here are some hints to help you do well on this project:

Pictures can be clipart, magazine cutouts, real pictures or personal artwork. If you choose to draw, drawings must be colored and detailed. Be creative! All **writing** must be your own work. Students that turn in work that is not their own writing in Spanish (i.e.: online translators or work written by another student) will receive a zero for the assignment.

You will present one of your stories to the class. Your presentation must be memorized. Presentations will start on Wednesday, April 7th.
